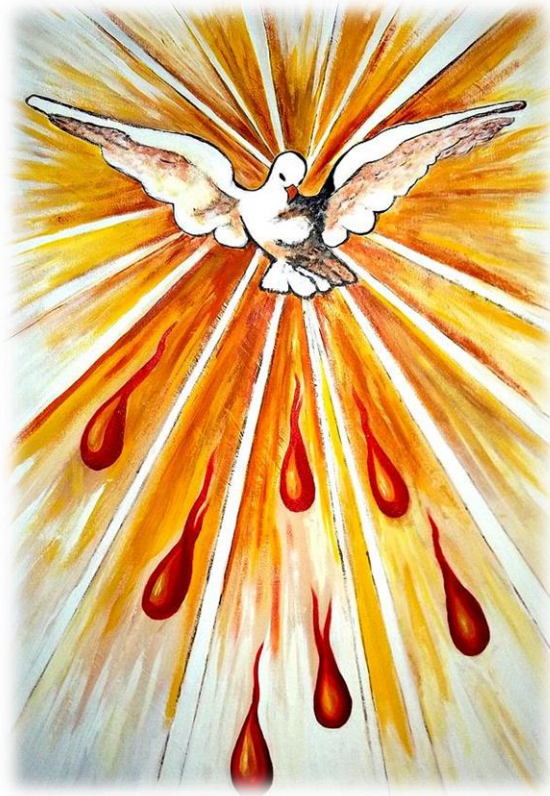

The First Lesson

Acts 2:1-21

Please be seated.

Lector: A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and

Arabs-- in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine."

But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

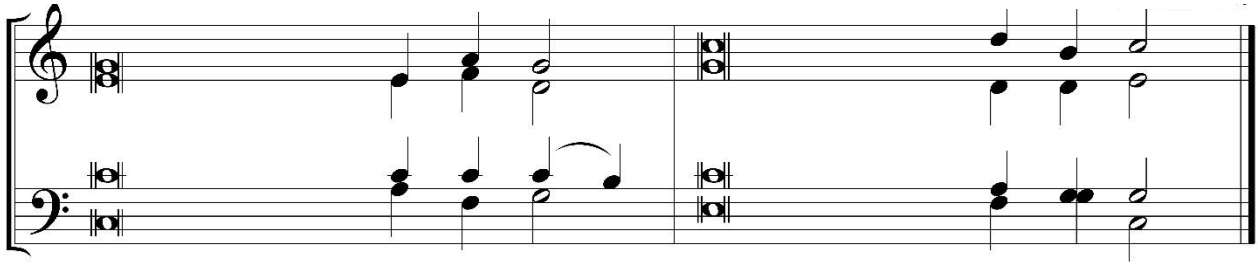
`In the last days it will be, God declares,

Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own; but the Father who dwells in me does his works. Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; but if you do not, then believe me because of the works themselves. Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father. I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it.

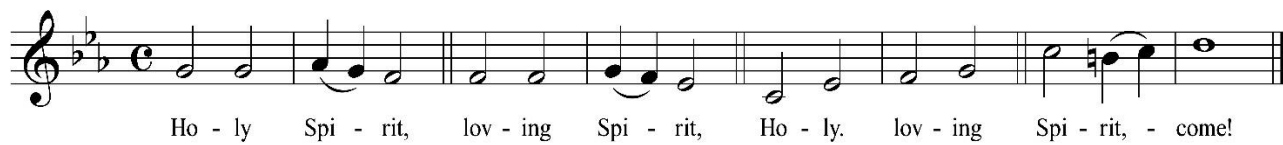

Presider: Here’s one thing you must understand about this blessing: it is not for you alone.

It is stubborn about this. Do not even try to lay hold of it if you are by yourself, thinking you can carry it on your own.

To bear this blessing you must first take yourself to a place where everyone does not look like you or think like you; a place where they do not believe precisely as you believe; where their thoughts and ideas and gestures are not exact echoes of your own.

Bring your sorrow. Bring your grief. Bring your fear. Bring your weariness, your pain, your disgust at how broken the world is, how fractured, how fragmented by its fighting, its wars, its hungers, its penchant for power, its ceaseless repetition of the history it refuses to rise above.

I will not tell you this blessing will fix all that.

But in the place where you have gathered, wait. Watch. Listen. Lay aside your inability to be surprised, your resistance to what you do not understand.

See then whether this blessing turns to flame on your tongue, sets you to speaking what you cannot fathom or opens your ear to a language beyond your imagining that comes as a knowing in your bones, a clarity in your heart that tells you this is the reason we were made: for this ache that finally opens us, for this struggle, this grace that scorches us toward one another and into the blazing day.

And may this blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit be among you now and remain with you always. **Amen.**

TODAY'S MUSIC

There are more than sixteen fine hymns in our Hymnal celebrating the Holy Spirit; today we get to sing five of them. Our anthem, Tallis's *If Ye Love Me*, is one of the great classics of the Elizabethan period of sacred music.

Kate Saphir is away on holiday. We welcome Bill Visscher to the organ bench this morning.

Organ Upgrade

We are delighted to report that our Schoenstein organ has recently grown by 61 pipes bringing the total number of pipes to about 1650. When Bill Visscher designed this installation of the 1981 organ, originally built for Star of the Sea Catholic Church in San Francisco, he left room for a 4' Harmonic Flute rank on the Swell Division, to be added at a future date. Recently he encountered just such a rank languishing in a corner of the now-closed Hupalo and Rupasky Pipe Organs shop and was able to procure it. He did a few adjustments to customize it for our instrument and it is now in service, all at no cost to Calvary. Thank you, Bill.

A two-page flyer with more specific information about the organ, including the new rank, is available in the narthex.
